He is the co-author of a book on Georgia Probate Law and several magazine articles in legal periodicals in his field. He is a life member of the TS, was very active in the Atlanta Lodge and the Mid-South Federation, and has been a longtime member of the National Judiciary Committee, and has several articles or comments published in the Quest Magazine. He has been a national lecturer for the TS for a number of years, and served on the TS National Board as a district director for two terms. Brant has spoken over the years at many TS lodges and study groups, and at the meetings of several TS Federations, including several times at the Mid-West Federation.
